THE GIS CERTIFICATION INSTITUTE

The GISCI is a not-for-profit organization that provides the geographic information systems (GIS) community with an internationally-recognized, complete certification program, a GISP® Certification.

Who is the GIS Certification Institute?

- The GIS Certification Institute (GISCI) is a 501(c)(6) non-profit organization.
- Based in the United States but present worldwide.
- Born from the late 1990's, URISA survey of its membership. The overwhelming response was a desire for professional certification.

GISCI Member Organizations

GISCI is composed of a group of Member Organizations representing the broad range of the geospatial community.





Governance

- One of the strengths of GISCI has been the strong and diversified Board representation over the years.
- Each Member Organization nominates two of its members to serve.
- An executive director works at the discretion of the Board.
- A small staff support the operations.

What's going on?

GISP Certification Accreditation

- GISCI is now a member of The Council of Engineering & Scientific Specialty Boards (CESB)
- GISP Certification Accreditation was recently approved in October 2024
 Category: Engineering Technician Category







New Testing Provider

- GISCI is switching to Pearson Vue
- GISPs will have access to over 4,400 testing centers
- Exam sign up process will be the same as in the past

- American Society for Photogrammetry & Remote Sensing joins GISCI Board
 - ASPRS GIS/LIS Technologist / Scientist certifications will sunset.

- New official study guide for GISP exam released

URISA Mentoring Network

- Foster strong connections between geospatial professionals at all stages of their careers.
- Prospective mentee is matched with a mentor, each pair is expected to meet monthly

GISP - Retired

GISP-R allows current GISP's to maintain their certification in a limited capacity upon retirement from the workforce and a paid position as a GIS Professional.

Minimum Qualifications

- GISP in good standing for a minimum of 3 consecutive recertification cycles (9 years).
- Must not be employed as a GIS professional.

Required Criteria

- Activities limited to using GIS professional skills in voluntary or charitable roles
- Signed ethics statement
- Fee \$50 (Initial 3-year period and each 3-year renewal with a 6-month grace period)



GISCI Endorsing Employer Designation

- Created to help increase the value of GISP Certification for our stakeholders, and to help facilitate the growth of the GISP Program.
- Granted to organizations that the GISCI deems to be supportive of GIS Professionals and the GISP Certification process.
- Available to all organizations at no cost.
- Each approved GISCI Endorsement will last for three (3) years, provide the organization with permission to display their organization logo on our website and provide permission to display the GISCI Endorsement designation on their website.



GISCI Endorsing Employer Designation

<u>Criteria</u>

- Encourage or require all GIS staff to have or obtain GISP certification during employment.
- Pay for initial GISP certification fees for candidates.
- Pay for ongoing GISP recertification fees for candidates.

In addition, organizations are strongly encouraged to meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Pay for training.
- Pay for GIS-related continuing education.
- Tie compensation to GISP Certification (e.g., bonus, raises).
- Promotion criteria includes required GISP Certification.
- Provide support for ongoing activities to maintain certification.
- Strive to meet the GISCI's ethical standards and support GISPs in meeting those standards.

PREGISP PROGRAM

GISCI is moving into the emerging professional segment by creating a pathway for recent graduates to grow into the requirements for becoming a GISP while becoming a geospatial professional.

What is the PreGISP Program?

- Accelerated pathway to becoming a GISP
- Offered as a certification
- Exam-only based
- Based on a standardized pre-professional exam based on UCGIS Geospatial Body of Knowledge
- Offered at the end of a student's career in their final GIS&T class
- Allows student to add credential to CV



What is the PreGISP Credential?

- Students who successfully pass the exam will be awarded the Emerging GISP credential and may use the GISP-E postnominal after their name.
- The credential will be valid for 3 years from date of award.
- The exam will be offered as an online proctored exam during a limited window in May and December.
- GISCI will work with academic institutions to integrate this into curriculums and potentially offer the exam at college campuses.



Who is a GISP-E candidate?

- Designed to be a capstone event for a graduating student of an accredited institution.
- May be taken at the conclusion of a student's academic career.
- Open to all students enrolled in a geospatially-related (as defined by the GIS&T Body of Knowledge) degree or certificate program.
- In the initial roll out, there will be an option for recent graduates (within 1 year of graduation), but after that concludes, it will only be available in the semester of or immediately after graduation.



When will the PreGISP kickoff?

- The PreGISP program is currently in development with key pieces completed.
- Soft rollout in December 2024
 - Limited number of participants
 - To be considered, candidates must sign up on the PreGISP page of GISCI.org
 - Ensure the system works properly
- Main rollout in May 2024
 - Develop sign up system
 - Open to all qualified candidates



Important Notes

- You must be in the final semester of your academic career to be eligible to take the exam or within 6 months of graduation.
- GISP-Es are eligible to become a GISP one-year early (3 years instead of 4) but will still be subject to all other requirements.
- Once the GISP-E expires, it cannot be renewed.
- GISP-Es will still need to complete the portfolio and exam requirements to become GISPs.




Young Professional Outreach

Pathways to GISP


- Guide to becoming a GISP candidate and geospatial professional

GISCI Geospatial Core Technical Knowledge Exam

Next Testing Date: December 7 - 15, 2024 Deadline to Apply: Two Weeks Before Test Session Starts Location: Worldwide at authorized Pearson VUE testing centers

- Submit your exam application. Apply online at the GISCI website (www.gisci.org).
 Pay the application and exam fees.
- 3) Schedule your specific exam date. After your payment is confirmed, Pearson VUE will send you an email with authorization to schedule your exam.
- 4) Take the exam at your scheduled test facility.

GISP PROCESS

Requirements & Costs for New and Recertifying GISPs

GISP Certification Requirements

Initial GISP: Portfolio + Exam

- Sign Ethics Statement
- Submit Portfolio Application online
 - Meet point requirements in Education, Experience, and Contributions to the Profession
 - Requires a minimum of 4 years of Geospatial Experience (employment)
- Pass GISCI Geospatial Core Technical Knowledge Exam

3 Year Certification Period

NOTE: You can complete the exam and portfolio in the order of your choosing.

Recertification: Portfolio Only

- Sign Ethics Statement
- Submit Portfolio Application online
 - Meet point requirements in Education and Contributions to the Profession (Experience Points optional)

3 Year Recertification Period



GISP Certification Costs

Initial GISP

- Portfolio Review Fee: \$200 (one-time fee)
- Exam Fee: \$250 (\$300 if international)
- Annual Maintenance Fee: \$95/year (starts in the 2nd year of initial certification period)

3 Year Certification Period

NOTE: If you do not pass the exam and need to retake, you will be charged the \$250 exam fee to retake but not the \$100 application fee.

Recertifying GISP

Annual Maintenance Fee:

\$95/year or single payment of \$285

3 Year Recertification Period
